## RACE

Race can be hard to define across cultures. Often is it defined as a person's identity or belonging to groups of humans created based on physical traits. Other times, race can be regarded as a group having a common, shared ancestry. However you define your race, racial identity is protected against discrimination in the City of Pittsburgh. Here are just a few examples:



## Housing

When based on race, it is illegal to:

- Harass a tenant or homeowner
- Impose different terms, conditions, or privileges
- Deny sale or rental

Harass an employee, or co-worker

Deny promotion or benefits

- Steer a potential buyer or renter from one home to another
- Refuse maintenance
- Place exclusionary advertising

## **Employment**

When based on race, it is illegal to:

- Provide different terms, conditions, or privileges in employment
- Deny a job or opportunity to apply





## **Public Accomodations**

When based on race, it is illegal to:

- Harass a customer or client
- Provide different offers
- Deny service or sale

 Deny entry to a place open to serve the public
