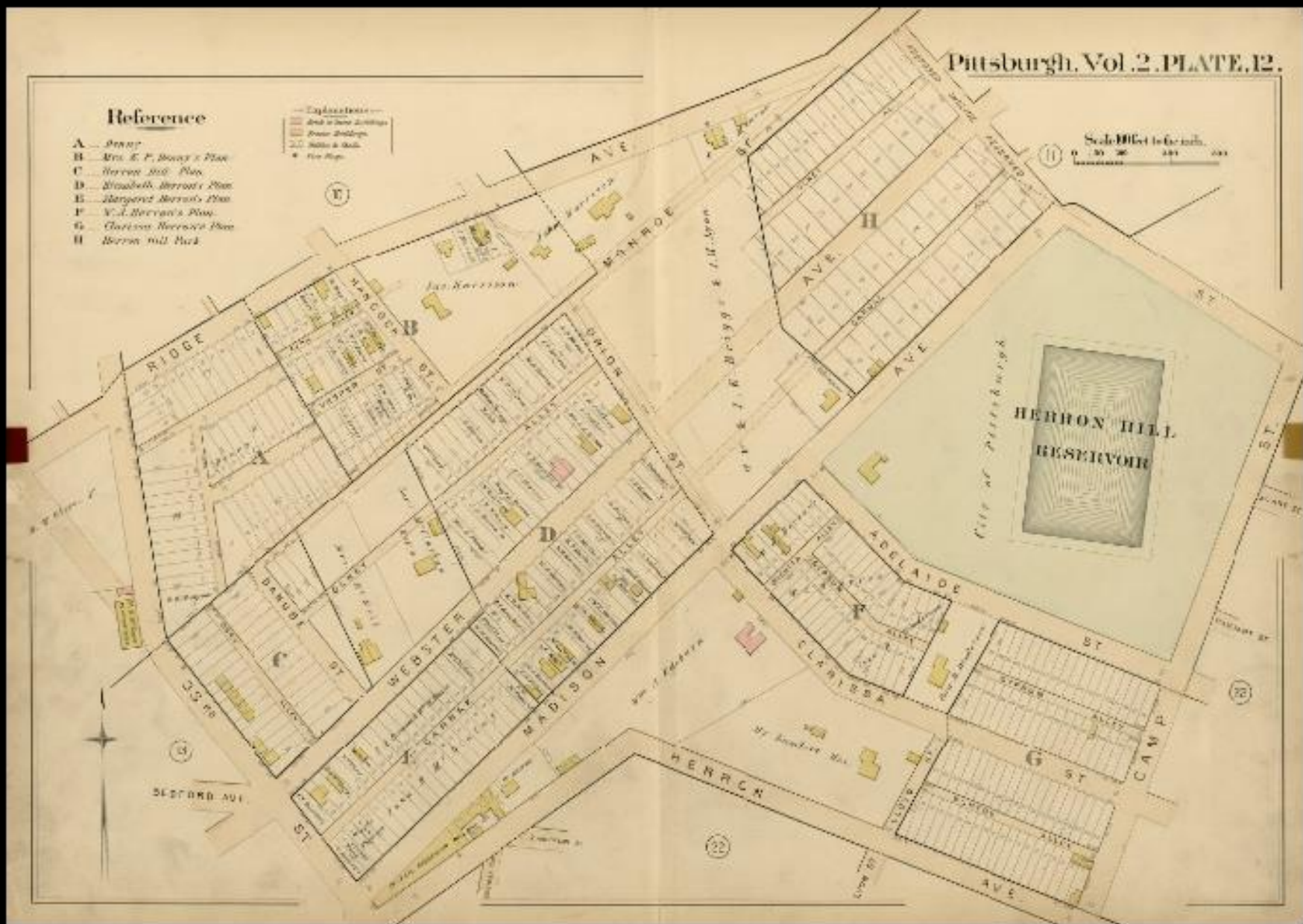

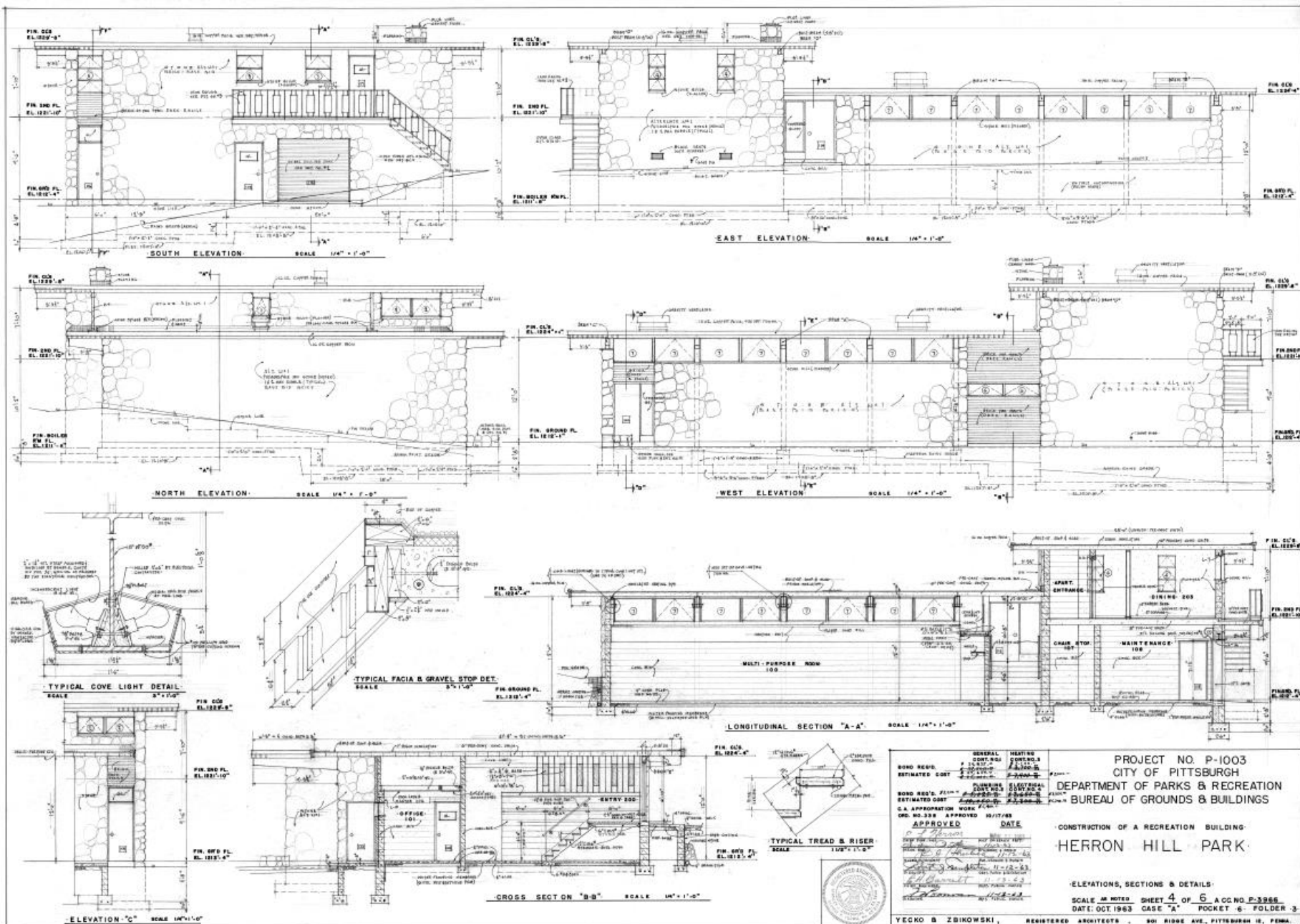

Robert E. Williams (1907-1964)

- Nicknamed “Pappy” because of his maturity and caring spirit.
- Lived by one philosophy: “You are your brother’s keeper.”
- In 1931, appointed to his first political position as deputy constable of Pittsburgh’s 5th Ward.
- In 1934, he was appointed to constable and would later open his own private detective agency.
- He became the first African-American detective in Pittsburgh (1945), the first African-American appointed as a magistrate in Pittsburgh (1946) and the first African-American in the state to be elected as a Democratic ward chairman (1947).
- Additionally, he was credited with helping to appoint the first African-American police lieutenant, patrol car officer and fire captain.
- In 2007, he was recognized at the Spirit of King Award Ceremony, for his lifetime achievements in the pursuit of human rights and equality in the spirit of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Massaro Facility Evaluation (2016)

- Masonry infill walls in the Multi-Purpose Room are cracked at the steel column locations.
- Exterior Doors are in fair to poor condition.
- Exterior Stair & Balcony poses a safety hazard.
- Mechanical Room Piping Insulation contains asbestos.
- Facility requires asbestos survey and removal.
- Soffit is deteriorated due to age and years of weather exposure and needs to be repaired.
- Existing Boiler is not working. Building is being heated with electric unit heaters in the Boiler Room & Restrooms. Multi-Purpose Room is heated with gas fire furnace. Upper Level is not being heated.
- Hot Water Tank Unit is leaking from the bottom of the tank and needs to be replaced immediately.
- Upper Level Apartment is in a state of severe neglect and disrepair.
- Exterior Paving has extensive cracking and the Basketball Court is severely cracked.
- **Therefore, the Facility should be demolished.**

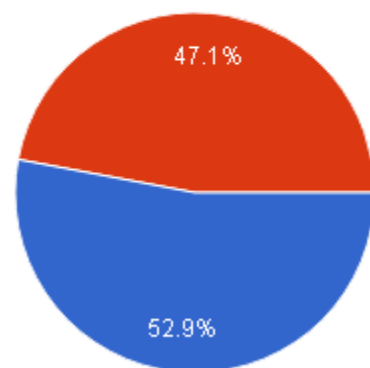

What is your gender?

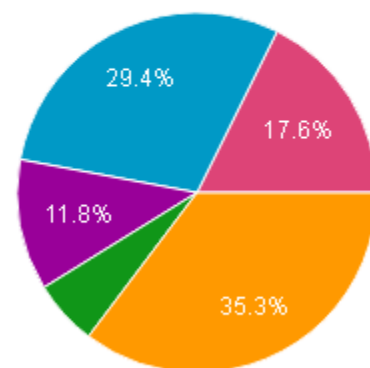

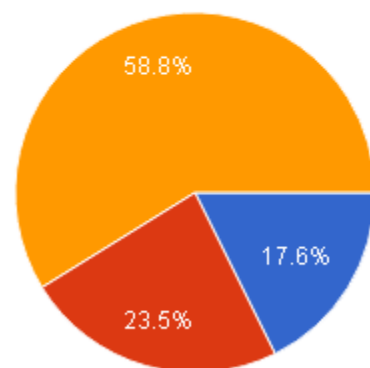

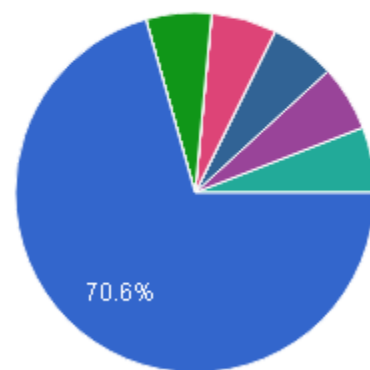

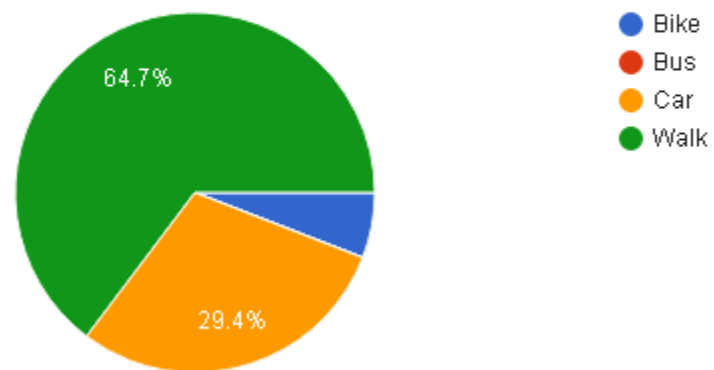

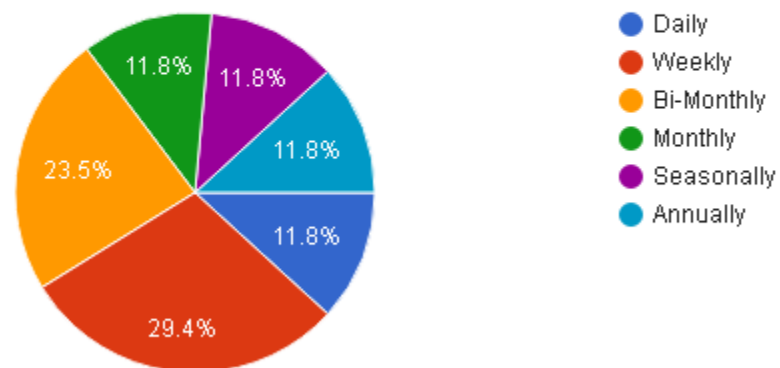
How do you typically get to the park?

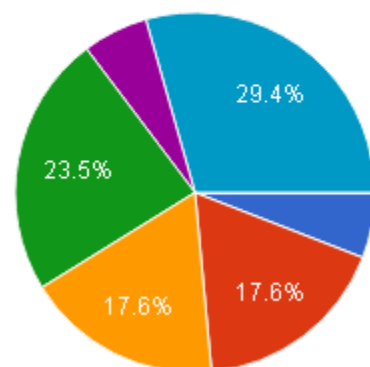
How often do you typically visit the park?
