Fixit Bike Repair Station


Frick Park and the surrounding neighborhoods are a popular area for cyclists who either use the trails or the bike lanes on Beechwood Boulevard. Biking in Pittsburgh is becoming an increasingly popular activity with expanded infrastructure and initiatives such as the new Bike Share Program. Inevitably, some bikers will experience technical difficulties on their trips.

Fixit is intended to equip even the most casual bike rider with the tools and knowledge to perform emergency repairs on their bicycle. The Fixit Bike Stand is equipped with commonly used tools as well as a QR Code that can direct smart phone users to a website that will assist them with repairs. Aside from emergency repairs, the Fixit Bike Stand provides a platform for bike owners to conduct routine maintenance. Typically, bike stands are expensive and take up a lot of space which deters many bike owners from purchasing a stand to assist with basic maintenance. These public stands could be an asset to all bike owners from recreational to die-hard commuters.



There is a wide variety of colors available from the manufacturer. DPW is requesting approval for galvanized, black and green as a standard.
