PROJECT OVERVIEW

- **Located in the community of Larimer, City of Pittsburgh within the crosswalk boundaries at the intersection of Larimer Avenue and Meadow Street**
- **Larimer Consensus Group (LCG) is the project lead in parentship with the Black Equity Coalition (BEC) and the Modern Anti-racist Data Ecosystems (MADE) Project Neighborhood Power Building Project Cohort (NPP).**
- **Collaborative effort between Community Residents, Community Organizations, the City of Pittsburgh and Project Stakeholders in the community.**
- **Street Art Mural Installation Project to assist with Traffic Calming in a high traffic area of the community**

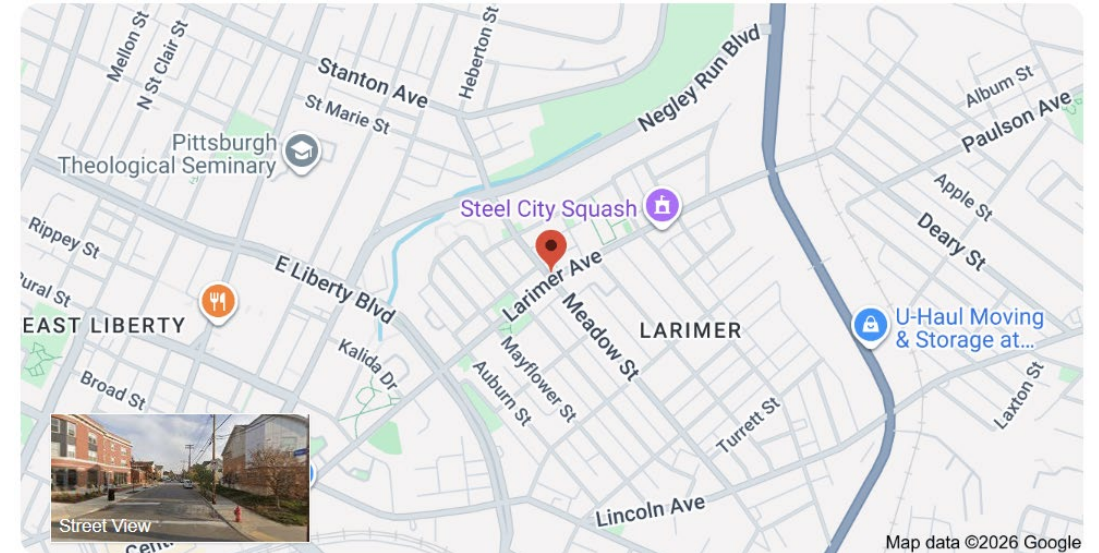
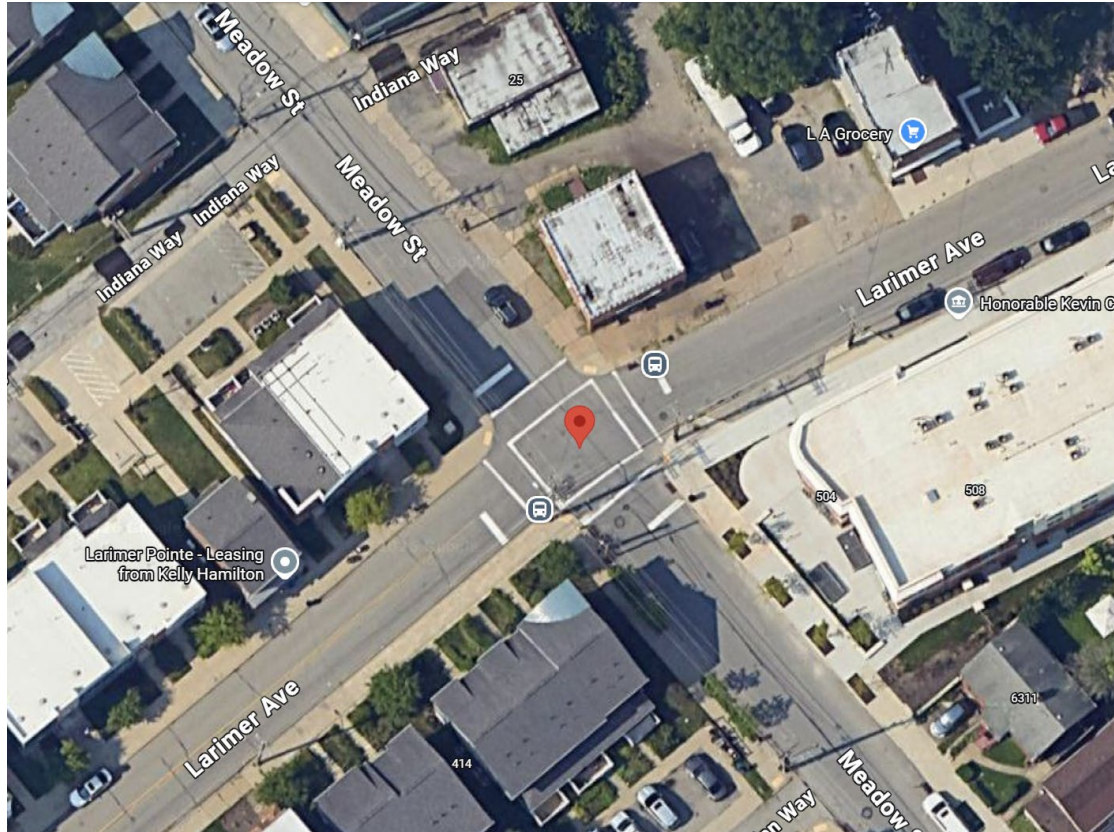
MADE NEIGHBORHOOD POWERBUILDING PROJECT

Modern Anti-racist Data Ecosystems (MADE) Project

- **Funded through a grant with the deBeaumont Foundation. Pittsburgh is one of four cities chosen throughout the Nation.**
- **Partnership between the Black Equity Coalition (BEC) and The City of Pittsburgh that builds decision-making power for Black residents.**
- **The project engages with that have been impacted by residential segregation and disinvestment, by creating public processes and power over data as it is used, governed, and disseminated in the City of Pittsburgh.**
- **The BEC and the City of Pittsburgh have partnered with the Larimer Consensus Group and 15 residents in the Larimer Community on a 2-year initiative focused on the topics of health equity and the use of data for building power and advocacy. The residents will emerge with a Built Environment Action Plan (BEAP) at the end of Project**

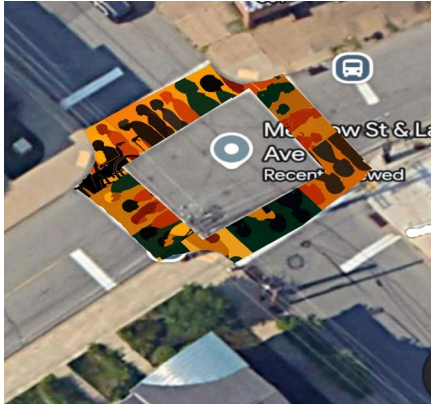


PROJECT SITE
