2025 TENNIS/PICKLEBALL PERMIT RULES

- · Permits must be paid for in advance for individuals and before the end of the season for schools.
- Tennis courts are for Tennis play only and Pickleball courts are for ٠ pickleball play ONLY. Absolutely no biking, rollerblading, skateboarding or playing of any other sport or activity is permitted on the courts.
- No pets allowed on the courts. ٠
- No alcohol allowed in the parks.
- No banners allowed to be erected on the fencing. •
- Do NOT cross behind players or run onto another court. Wait for play to stop, then ask for permission to enter the court.
- Please refrain from using offensive language and disrupting players on nearby courts.
- Permit holder is responsible for picking up all trash and disposing of it in the appropriate receptacles. No glass containers allowed.
- Permit holder must relinguish their court in a timely manner, especially if there are others waiting for the court.
- If there is a problem with the net or court surface, please notify any ٠ CitiParks or Community Tennis Association staff onsite. If there are no staff onsite, you may move to another open court, if available. If there are no open courts, send an email within 24 hours to citiparkstennis@pittsburghpa.gov with an image of the problem.
- Please note that the CitiParks courts are open to the public, so they are not maintained to a professional standard. Courts are permitted "As Is", unless the net breaks or the court surface develops a material defect.
