PLI's Guidelines for Temporary Structures	Issued: 1/31/2021
During COVID	

**PURPOSE:** The following document outlines PLI's temporary policy for the use of temporary structures in effect during Pennsylvania Governor Wolf's emergency Green Phase order. This policy is intended to provide guidance for property owners, applicants, contractors and trade license holders.

## PLI'S GUIDELINES FOR TEMPORARY STRUCTURES DURING COVID

1. <u>Applicability</u>: This policy applies for structures to be erected for **180 days or less** during Pennsylvania Governor Wolf's emergency Green Phase order and to occupied structures erected on private property or in the public right of way.

NOTE: Structures in the right of way also require review and approval from the Department of Mobility and Infrastructure (DOMI). Please refer to DOMI's "<u>Guidance For Winter Outdoor</u> <u>Dining and Retail in the City of Pittsburgh</u>" for additional information.

- <u>Other Guidelines</u>: Unless modified under this policy, the permit process for temporary structures shall follow the process outlined under current "<u>External Guidelines For Temporary Outdoor</u> <u>Occupancies</u>" including:
  - a. Application Submission
  - b. Application Review
  - c. Permit Issuance
  - d. Permit Inspection
  - e. Permit Completion
- 3. <u>Application Type:</u> Structures erected for 180 days or less shall require submission of a PLI "Occupancy Only" permit. Structures erected for more than 180 days shall require submission of a building permit.

- 4. <u>Documentation and Installation Requirements</u>: The following standards shall apply based on structure type and size as identified below:
  - a. <u>Tents and canopies 150 square feet or less:</u> Tents and canopies 150 square feet or less in area shall require:
    - i. <u>Submission</u>: The applicant shall provide site plan as documented in "<u>DCP-PLI</u> <u>External Guidelines For Temporary Outdoor Occupancies</u>" and identify the type and location of all proposed heating devices.
    - ii. <u>Installation</u>: These tents or canopies shall be ballasted at each corner with 700 pound weights or securely staked/fastened to the ground below or ballasted per the tent manufacturers' requirements.
  - b. <u>Tents and canopies over 150 square feet</u>: Tents and canopies over 150 square feet in area shall require:
    - i. <u>Submission</u>: Applicant shall provide:
      - 1. A site plan as documented in "<u>DCP-PLI External Guidelines For</u> <u>Temporary Outdoor Occupancies</u>" and identify the type and location of all proposed heating devices.
      - A structural report from a PA licensed architect or engineer recommending appropriate anchorage and/or ballast per design loads of 90 MPH design wind speed and 30 PSF ground snow load.
    - ii. <u>Installation</u>: These tents or canopies shall be ballasted and/or anchored per PLI approved structural report.
  - c. <u>Multiple Tents and canopies</u>: Multiple tents or canopies that are not separated by a least 3 feet shall be considered a single tent for determination of permit requirements.
  - d. <u>All other Structures</u>: All other structures, including but not limited to enclosed structures such as domes, igloos, and greenhouses, shall require:
    - i. <u>Submission</u>: Applicant shall provide:
      - 1. A site plan as documented in "<u>DCP-PLI External Guidelines For</u> <u>Temporary Outdoor Occupancies</u>" and identify the type and location of all proposed heating devices.
      - 2. A structural report from a PA licensed architect or engineer confirming said structure can withstand design loads of 90 MPH design wind speed and 30 PSF ground snow load and recommending appropriate anchorage and/or ballast.
    - ii. <u>Installation</u>: These structures shall be ballasted and/or anchored per PLI approved structural report.
- 5. <u>Heating Devices</u>: Proposed heating devices shall be documented on the submitted site plans. Installation shall comply with standards outlined in DOMI's "<u>Guidance For Winter Outdoor</u> <u>Dining and Retail in the City of Pittsburgh</u>".
