Safe Passage is a school-based anti-violence program rooted in treating the disease of violence using a public health approach and the Safe Passage Safety Model. It is currently implemented at Allderdice High, Arlington PreK-8, Brashear High, UPrep 6-12, Obama Academy 6-12, Perry High, and Westinghouse High to reduce the transmission of the disease of violence among Pittsburgh Public Schools students and their communities.

Discipline and Violence Decreases Among Safe Passage Schools

District-wide Pittsburgh Public Schools data from the beginning of the school year through February for 2023-24 and 2024-25, across all Safe Passages schools, demonstrates an overall decrease in the number of discipline events and the number of unique students involved in such events:

- 27% decrease in total discipline events.
- 25% decrease in major discipline events.
- 14% decrease in students involved.
- 7.7% decrease in violent events.

Safety Ambassadors Trained to "See Something, Say Something"

Multiple Safe Passage programs host and participate in their school's SAVE Promise Club. At Obama's Safe Passage led SAVE Promise Club, Safety Ambassadors participated in a field trip that provided an important opportunity for Safety Ambassadors to engage in training for the "See Something, Say Something" initiative.

This program taught students how to identify and report potentially dangerous or concerning situations, which directly aligns with Pillar I of the Safe Passage Safety Model: Detect and Interrupt. The Safety Ambassadors in attendance for this training were Jimar Mangham, Zamir Marshall, Devon Robinson-Young, and Jai'Mere Jennings. This reflects their commitment to fostering safety and awareness within the community through multiple avenues.







Community Health and Healing

It is instrumental to the foundation of Safe Passage to support each other through times of both strength and strife. Over the past few months, Safe Passage Coordinators from every school have been coming together to collectively support and uplift each of our schools, students, and community.

Additionally, staff underwent a Narcan Training through the Office of Community Health & Safety. This training taught staff how to recognize signs of an overdose and how to administer Narcan. This was critical to Safe Passage's mission of ensuring the safety and well-being of the communities we serve.
