Safe Passage is a school-based anti-violence program rooted in treating the disease of violence using a public health approach and the Safe Passage Safety Model. It is currently implemented at Allderdice High, Brashear High, UPrep 6-12, Obama Academy 6-12, Perry High, and Westinghouse High to reduce the transmission of the disease of violence among Pittsburgh Public Schools students and their communities.

Exploring Opportunities at Duquesne University

Safety Ambassadors took their leadership beyond their local neighborhoods with an empowering visit to Duquesne University.

Safety Ambassadors participated in an Admissions presentation, explored campus alongside University Ambassadors, and met with Dr. Chris Harris and the Office of Community Engagement to learn how education and community partnerships drive positive change.

This experience reflects the four pillars of Safe Passage's violence prevention model. By connecting youth to opportunities for growth, leadership, and education, Safe Passage continues to empower young people to be visible role models and peacebuilders in their communities.

Learning Wellness from the Steelers

In October, Safety Ambassadors were invited to Acrisure Stadium to take part in a Youth Empowerment and Mental Health Yoga event hosted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in partnership with Neighborhood Resilience Project, Just Heal Bro, and Steel Smiling.

Alongside other youth from the community, Safety Ambassadors learned the importance of caring for their mental health and building safer communities. To make the experience even more meaningful, Pittsburgh Steelers players shared first-hand strategies for maintaining their own well-being and even joined the youth on the mat for yoga!



End of Year Peace Event


