

# City of Pittsburgh Plastic Bag Ordinance <u>Compliance Guide</u>

#### 1. Single-use plastic carryout bags are not permitted.

- All establishments must comply.
- The ordinance applies to bags used in-store, at pick-up, and for takeout or delivery.
- The ordinance also applies to biodegradable, plantbased, and compostable plastic bags.

### 2. At least 10 cents must be charged for each compliant paper bag provided to customers at all points-of-sale.

- Paper bags must contain at least 40% post-consumer recycled content and cannot contain old growth fiber.
- Free paper bags can be given to SNAP/WIC/EBT users.
- Bag fees must have their own line item on receipts.
- Establishments retain all bag fees.

### 3. The ordinance does not apply to plastic or paper bags used for the following purposes:

- Bringing loose and bulk goods to the checkout, such as:
  - Unwrapped prepared foods, bakery goods.
  - Fruits, vegetables, grains, nuts, candies.
  - Uncooked meats or fish.
- Holding any dry-cleaning, medication, flowers, or plants.

#### 4. The City of Pittsburgh will be inspecting for compliance.

- Inspections will be random or in response to 311 complaints.
- Upon discovery of a violation, the following will happen:
  - The inspector will outline the violation and give a warning.
  - After 4 6 weeks, the inspector will return to check compliance.
  - Citations will be issued if compliance is not met by the 3rd visit.
  - Fines will accumulate daily until compliance is achieved.



### City of Pittsburgh Plastic Bag Ordinance Compliance Checklist

Download and review the compliance guide, supplier guide, FAQ, and other resources posted on our website to help you enter compliance.
Stop distributing single-use plastic carryout bags. You may offer compliant paper bags or reusable bags instead. You are NOT allowed to continue using any remaining inventory of plastic bags.
Update points-of-sale (in-store, online, mobile, phone, third-party delivery apps) to charge a minimum of 10¢ for each paper bag provided.
Ensure paper bags contain a minimum of 40% post-consumer recycled content and are not made from old growth forest.
List the paper bag fee as a separate line item on every receipt using "carry- out bag charge" or wording that shows the fee is for bags.
Remind employees to ask customers if they want a bag before providing one and that they may waive the paper bag fee for WIC/SNAP/EBT users.
At sale, charge customers at least 10¢ per paper carryout bag provided.
OPTIONAL: Download signage from our website to post inside of your establishment providing information on the bag ban.
